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Our Classroom

These are some of the things we will learn about in our class...

When you return in September, we will begin by learning about wartime Britain and what turned the tide in favour of the allies during WW2. In design and technology, we will learn about the structure of Anderson shelters, which were used during the war and create our own.

Further linking to wartime Britain, we will explore the text 'Letters to the lighthouse' in English and develop our craft as aspiring writers and confident readers. This text is about two children that are evacuated from London during the war, their sister mysteriously goes missing along the way and they set out to find where she went and why.

Things that will help us work well in class...

Listening: a key skill that will determine your ability to understand and attempt the different tasks given to you. It also constitutes good manners, which are held in high regard in our class.

Independence: being able to work off your own back is important in year 6. You will be taught all the skills that you need and then we will expect you to put them into practise.

Being reflective: it is your education and you are ultimately responsible for how it turns out. We will expect you to reflect upon each piece of work you complete and consider how you have done and what your next steps are; knowing your targets and taking steps to achieve them is important to the speed that you make progress.
